33 Plaintiff anticipates calling the following as witnesses:

36 **Ruby Tate.** Ruby Tate is the claims manager at the Industrial Commission and  
37  
38 will testify as to what is inside the Industrial Commission files, and whether or not  
39  
40 the claims division “adjudicate” matters, how many workman’s compensation matters  
41  
42 are processed before the Industrial Commission each year/month/quarter/period of  
43  
44 time, what goes on inside the Industrial Commission, and other matters. Among other  
45  
46 testimony.

1                   **Andrew Campbell.** Andrew Campbell is the chief administrative law judge at  
2  
3 the Industrial Commission and will testify as to what is inside the Industrial  
4  
5 Commission files, what the contents are of the oral hearings, how many workman's  
6  
7 compensation matters are processed before the Industrial Commission each  
8  
9 year/month/quarter/period of time, what goes on inside the Industrial Commission,  
10  
11 whether or not administrative law judges or himself has specifically denied access to  
12  
13 the public to oral hearings, the existence of administrative law judge calendars, how  
14  
15 hearings are calendared, and other matters. Among other testimony.

17                   **Dennis P. Kavanaugh, Joseph M. Hennelly Jr., D. Alan Everett, Maria**  
18  
19 **Cecilia Valdez, and Orion Godfrey.** These witnesses are the 5 appointed Industrial  
20  
21 Commissioners, who will testify as to who they have permitted to "adjudicate"  
22  
23 workman's compensation claims (especially bad faith claims, especially considering  
24  
25 that the relevant administrative code does not prescribe who EXACTLY in the  
26  
27 commission is tasked with adjudicating bad faith claims), the number of workman's  
28  
29 compensation claims that the Industrial Commission processes, and who the  
30  
31 commissioners have tasked with processing Industrial Commission claim files and  
32  
33 produce public records from public records requests (which will lead to whether or  
34  
35 not they acted "promptly" under A.R.S. § 39-121.01(E)), and testify as to the names  
36  
37 of persons who are in possession and handle public records inside the Industrial  
38  
39 Commission. Among other testimony.

41                   **Kara Dimas,** the Industrial Commission secretary. She will testify as to the  
42  
43 records she possesses regarding decisions made by the 5 appointed commissioners as

15 to the contents of the workman’s compensation hearings and provide testimony as to  
16 what is inside the workman’s compensation files that are allegedly confidential, and  
17 testify as to the existence or non-existence of administrative law judge calendars and  
18 their calendaring system and whether or not they have assistants that assist them,  
19 among other testimony.

29 **Harriet Turney.** She is an ombudsman at the Industrial Commission, and will  
30 testify whether or not simply giving an ICA claim number gives total unfettered

38 **The Claims Division of the Industrial Commission,** as represented in the  
39 following table. They will testify who investigates bad faith claims and who does  
40 what inside that department. This will lead to whether or not the Industrial  
41 Commission is liable under A.R.S. § 39-121.01(B) and Article 2 § 11 and Article 18 §  
42 8 for failure to indicate on the bad faith awards from the claims division who
